Project Green Sweep Rids Stratford Of 27 Tons Of Waste

Stratford— Mayor John A. Harkins today thanked the volunteers and town employees who volunteered their time on Saturday, May 1st to participate in “Project Green Sweep”. The “spring cleaning” project, sponsored by the Stratford Beautification Committee under the leadership of Chairwoman Kimberly Meuse, seeks to engage residents in the improvement of the town’s appearance by removing unsightly refuse from public and private properties. The Department of Public Works collected 27 tons of waste from the volunteers’ efforts.

“I ran for Mayor on a platform of restoring the pride in our community, and there is no better example of that pride than Project Green Sweep,” said Mayor Harkins. “How residents, businesses, and public entities maintain their properties says a lot about the character of a town.
