### Training - The Nationwide Suspicious Activity Reporting (**SAR**) Initiative (NSI) Suspicious Activity Reporting Training (available on-line and on-site)

Partner agencies, Private Sector, Port Area Marine Groups, Port Area Maritime Support Network members.

1) Online Suspicious Activity Reporting (**SAR**) Training for Law Enforcement and Hometown Security Partners - The Nationwide Suspicious Activity Reporting (**SAR**) Initiative (NSI) training strategy is a multifaceted approach designed to increase the effectiveness of state, local, and tribal law enforcement and public safety professionals and other frontline partners in identifying, reporting, evaluating, and sharing pre-incident terrorism indicators to prevent acts of terrorism. To increase the effectiveness of this multifaceted approach, the NSI has developed on-line training programs (available at: [http://nsi.ncirc.gov/training\\_online.aspx](http://nsi.ncirc.gov/training_online.aspx)) specific to **private sector security** personnel, frontline LE officers, fire and EMS personnel, emergency management personnel, probation/parole/corrections personnel, and public safety telecommunications regarding documented and verified behaviors and indicators that, when viewed in the totality of circumstances, may indicate terrorism-related criminal activity. Both the SAR Line Officer Training and each sector-specific SAR Hometown Security Partners Training discuss how to report identified suspicious activity to the proper authorities while maintaining the protection of citizens' privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties.
