### **Wayne's Walk – Uber Collaboration**

Darin Bershefsky, President of the Wayne's Walk Foundation, introduced a new and innovative partnership with Uber to provide safe rides for Stratford residents. The Safe Rides pilot program will run through the month of February. Every Friday, Saturday and Sunday between 6:00 p.m. - 2:00 a.m., Stratford resident who chose to use Uber within Town lines after drinking, can get a free ride using the Wayne's Walk option. Each Uber user can use the option and have up to 2 free rides per month.



## Update on Opioids— Addressing Overlapping Heroin and Rx Opioid Problems

## Key Point from Dr. Compton

- Overdoses are happening more and more due to mixing. Almost all include mixing with alcohol.
  - Combination of benzodiazepines (Valium, Xanax) with opioid is remarkably dangerous.
  - Fentanyl is a powerful synthetic opiate similar but more potent than morphine.
    - 80-100 X more potent than morphine
    - 25-40 X more potent than heroin



## Key Point from Dr. Compton

- Access:
  - ~200 million opiate prescriptions written
  - Price of heroin is 1/5 the price 20 years ago
  - Those obtaining opioid medications:
    - 53% obtain for free from family/friends
    - 14.6% bought/took from family/friends
    - 4.3% obtain from drug dealer/stranger



## Key Point from Dr. Compton

- In general, people are frightened by heroin, but not Rx opioids.
  - Rx opioid medication is the same class as heroin—meaning effects are no different when it reaches the brain and central nervous system.
