The Town of Stratford through the Office of the Purchasing Agent, will receive SEALED BIDS for furnishing the equipment described in the accompanying specifications, in accordance with the instructions, conditions and reservations that follow:

**A. CLOSING DATE:**

Bids will be received until 3:00 pm December 21, 2017 at which time they will be publicly opened and read. All bidders are invited to attend this public opening, which will be held immediately following the closing time specified above, in the Office of the Purchasing Agent, Room 202, Town Hall, 2725 Main Street, Stratford, CT 06615.

Any bid may be withdrawn prior to the above-scheduled time for receiving bids or authorized postponement thereof. Any bids received after the date and time specified shall NOT be considered. No bidder may withdraw a bid within 45 days after the actual opening thereof.

**B. INSTRUCTIONS:**

Bid proposals are to be submitted **(TWO COPIES)** in a sealed envelope and clearly marked with the bid number and description on the outside of the envelope, including all outer packaging (DHL, FedEx, UPS, etc).

## C. CONDITIONS:

### **Bid Surety:**

A Certified Check, Cashier's Check or Bid Bond in the amount of \$2,500.00 must accompany each proposal, made payable to the Town of Stratford. No bid will be considered without this surety. Upon award or rejection of the bid, all Certified Checks or Cashier's Checks received in lieu of Bid Bonds will be returned to the bidders.

**Payment:** Final payment will be made upon the acceptance of the completed work by an authorized representative of the Town of Stratford. NO partial payments will be made. Invoices covering the work specified herein should be forwarded to the Purchasing Department upon completion of the project.

**Taxes:** The Town of Stratford is exempt from all State and Federal taxes. Do not include these amounts in your quotation.

**Addendums:** All addendums will be posted on the town website, [www.townofstratford.com](http://www.townofstratford.com). It is the responsibility of the bidder to check the website for any addendums before submitting their bid.

**F.O.B. Destination:** All prices quoted must be net delivered to destination.

**Conflict of Interest:** No public official or employee shall, while serving as such, have any financial interest or engage in any business, employment, transaction or professional activity or incur any obligation of any nature which is in substantial conflict with the proper discharge of his/her duties or employment in the public interest.

### **Insurance Requirements:**

#### A. General Liability

Occurrence limit \$1,000,000; aggregate limit \$2,000,000. The insurance carried by the proposer shall be on form CG 00 01, or equivalent. The Town of Stratford shall be named as an additional insured on the contractor's General Liability Insurance Policy with form CG 20 10 or CG 20 33, *and* CG 20 37.

#### B. Automobile Liability

Combined single limit of \$1,000,000. Comprehensive automobile policy to cover all owned, hired or non-owned automobiles or vehicles.

#### C. Workers Compensation

The proposer must have workers' compensation and employers liability insurance as required by Connecticut and federal law, plus employers liability limits of \$1,000,000 per accident, 1,000,000 disease each employee and \$1,000,000 disease policy limit.

#### D. Umbrella Liability

The proposer shall have a minimum coverage of \$1,000,000 excess umbrella coverage, naming the Town as additional insured.

The proposer shall procure and pay for the insurance coverage described above and must maintain the indicated insurance for a period of two (2) years after completion of the contract. All policies shall provide for thirty (30) days written notice prior to cancellation, substantial change or nonrenewal. The successful bidder must file an Insurance Certificate within two weeks of the date of notification of award. Failure or neglect to do so may be considered by the Town as proof that the proposer is unable to fulfill the contract. A current insurance certificate and a copy of the endorsement or policy wording adding the Town as Additional Insured must be in the Town's possession at all times. In addition, the selected firm shall require its subcontractors, if any, to meet the same insurance requirements and to furnish the Town with similar evidence of insurance.

In addition, the proposer shall, at all times, save, indemnify and hold harmless the Town of Stratford, its officers, agents, employees and servants from liability of any nature or kind, including costs and expenses for or on account of, any patented or copyrighted equipment, materials, articles, or processes used in the performance of this contract, or on account of any and all claims, damages, losses, litigation expense and counsel fees arising out of loss or injuries (including death) sustained by or alleged to have been sustained by the public or any persons affected by the proposer's work, or by the proposer or any subcontractor, or anyone directly or indirectly employed by them while engaged in the performance of their duties in connect

#### **D. RESERVATIONS:**

The Town of Stratford may consider informal any proposal not prepared and submitted to the Town in accordance with the provisions herein stated. The Town of Stratford reserves the right to reject any or all proposals or parts of proposals; to waive defects in same proposals; or to accept any proposal or part thereof deemed to be in the best interests of the Town of Stratford.

## ***GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS FOR TREE AND STUMP REMOVAL WORK***

### **SECTION 1.0 - SCOPE OF SERVICES**

To provide all supervision, labor, tools, equipment and services required for performing tree maintenance work in the Town of Stratford as specified herein.

### **SECTION 2.0 - QUALIFICATIONS OF BIDDERS**

- A. Bidding on this contract shall be limited to individuals, partnerships and corporations actively engaged in the field of arboriculture. Bidders shall derive a majority of income from arboriculture work. Bidders shall demonstrate competence, experience, and financial capability to carry out the terms of this contract. The Town may require proof of these qualifications.
- B. References must be submitted to establish experience of bidder.
- C. Bidder must have the ability to respond and commence work within three (3) hours of receiving emergency requests.

### **SECTION 3.0 - SAFETY STANDARDS**

- A. All equipment to be used and all work to be performed must be in full compliance with the most current revision of American National Standards Institute Standard Z-133.1 (Safety Requirements for Pruning, Trimming, Repairing, Maintaining, Removing Trees and for Cutting Brush). These standards are made part of this contract by this reference.
- B. The Contractor shall be solely responsible for pedestrian and vehicular safety and control within the work site and shall provide the necessary warning devices, barricades, and ground personnel needed to give safety, protection, and warning to persons and vehicular traffic within the area.
- C. Blocking of public streets shall not be permitted unless prior arrangements have been made with the town and is coordinated with appropriate departments. Traffic control and any additional costs incurred on the contractor's behalf to conform to local ordinances and codes is the responsibility of the Contractor and shall be accomplished in conference with State, County, and Local highway construction codes. Attachments include a list of streets requiring private duty police officers.

#### **SECTION 4.0 - LIABILITY FOR DAMAGE TO PROPERTY AND/OR PLANT MATERIAL**

Tree Damage: Climbing irons, spurs or spikes are not to be used on trees to be pruned. Any tree damage caused by the Contractor should be repaired immediately at no additional expense to the satisfaction of the Town. Trees damaged beyond repair, as judged by a qualified arborist acceptable to the Town and the Contractor whose expenses shall be jointly covered by both parties, are to be removed at no expense to the town, and replaced by a tree of size and species designated at no additional expense to the town or the dollar value of such damaged trees, as determined by a qualified arborist acceptable to the town and the Contractor whose expenses shall be jointly covered by both parties, is deducted from the moneys owed the Contractor.

#### **SECTION 5.0 - DISCONTINUANCE OF WORK**

Any practice obviously hazardous as determined by a representative of the town shall be immediately discontinued by the Contractor upon receipt of either written or oral notice to discontinue such practice.

#### **SECTION 6.0 - OBSERVANCE OF LAWS, ORDINANCES AND REGULATIONS**

- A. The Contractor at all times during the term of this contract shall observe and abide by all Federal, State, and Local laws which in any way affect the conduct of the work and shall comply with all decrees and orders of courts of competent jurisdiction. The Contractor shall comply fully and completely with any and all applicable State and Federal Statutes, rules and regulations as they relate to hiring, wages, and any other applicable conditions of employment.

- B. **OSHA**

The bidder must certify that all equipment complies to all regulations and conditions stipulated under the Williams-Steiger Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1971, as amended. The successful bidder must further certify that all items furnished under this project will conform to and comply with Federal and State of Connecticut OSHA standards. Successful bidder must agree to indemnify and hold harmless the Town of Stratford for any and all damages that maybe assessed against the Town.

#### **SECTION 7.0 - WORKING IN PROXIMITY TO ELECTRICAL HAZARDS**

(This section is taken from American National Standard Institute Z-133.1 1982)

- A. An inspection shall be made by the tree worker and by the supervisor to determine whether an electrical conductor passes through the tree or passes within reaching distance of the tree worker before climbing, entering, or working around any tree.

- B. Only a qualified line-clearance tree trimmer or qualified line clearance tree trimmer trainee shall be assigned to the work if it is found that an electrical hazard exists. A trainee shall be under the direct supervision of qualified personnel. (A qualified line-clearance tree trimmer is a tree worker who through related training and on-the-job experience is familiar with the special techniques and hazards involved in line clearance. A trainee is a worker regularly assigned to line-clearance tree-trimming, and has demonstrated his ability to perform his duties safely at his level of training. OSHA Standard 29CFR 1910)
- C. There shall be a second qualified line-clearance tree trimmer or line-clearance tree trimmer trainee within normal voice communication during line-clearance operations aloft when the line-clearance tree trimmer or line-clearance trainee must approach more closely than 10 feet (3m) to any conductor or electrical apparatus energized in excess of 750 volts: or (1) When branches or limbs being removed cannot first be cut (with a pole pruner/pole saw) sufficiently clear of the primary conductors and apparatus so as to avoid contact, or, (2) When roping is required to remove branches or limbs from such conductors or apparatus.
- D. Tree trimmer trainees shall maintain the following clearances from energized conductors:

- E. All other workers shall maintain a minimum clearance of 10 feet (3m) from energized conductors rated 50kV phase-to-phase or less; for conductors rated over 50kV phase-to-phase the minimum clearance shall be 10 feet plus 4/10 (3m plus 10mm) for each kilovolt over 50kV.
- F. Ladders, platforms, and aerial devices, including insulated aerial devices, shall not be brought in contact with an electrical conductor.

- G. When an aerial lift device contacts an electrical conductor, the truck supporting the aerial lift shall be considered as energized, and contact with the truck shall be avoided except where emergency rescue procedures are being carried out. Emergency rescue should only be attempted by properly trained persons familiar with electrical hazards.

## **SECTION 8.0 - PROTECTION OF OVERHEAD UTILITIES**

Tree trimming and removal operations may be conducted in areas where overhead electric, telephone, and cable television facilities exist. The Contractor shall protect all utilities from damage, shall immediately contact the appropriate utility if damage should occur, and shall be responsible for all claims for damage due to his operations.

The Contractor shall make arrangements with the utility for removal of all necessary limbs and branches which may conflict with or create a personal injury hazard in conducting the operations of this contract.

## **SECTION 9.0 - THE PROTECTION OF UNDERGROUND UTILITIES**

The Contractor shall be responsible for contacting the appropriate utility (i.e. "Call Before You Dig") for location of any underground utility services which are in the work area and which could be damaged by the Contractor's operation (i.e. stump grinding).

## **SECTION 10.0 - LOCATION AND SCHEDULE OF WORK**

The town reserves the right to change, add, or delete areas or quantities to be removed as it deems to be in its best interest. Tree trimming and removal operations shall commence no later than 10 days after contract has been awarded and continued until completion. **ALL WORK SHALL BE COMPLETED WITHIN TWO MONTHS FROM THE START OF THE CONTRACT.** Unless otherwise authorized by the town, failure of the Contractor to comply with the approved schedule shall be sufficient cause to give notice that the Contractor is in default of the contract.

## **SECTION 11.0 - CLEANUP AND SITE RESTORATION**

- A. All debris from tree trimming, tree removal, and stumping operations shall be cleaned up each day before the work crew leaves the site, unless permission is given by the Tree Warden or his Deputy Tree Warden to do otherwise.
- B. All lawn areas shall be raked, all streets and sidewalks shall be swept, and all brush, branches and logs shall be removed from the site. Areas are to be left in a condition equal to that which existed prior to the commencement of forestry operations.
- C. It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to remove and dispose in a proper and acceptable manner all logs, brush, and debris resulting from the tree maintenance

operations at the Contractor's expense unless otherwise directed by the Tree Warden or Deputy Tree Warden.

#### **SECTION 12.0 - WORKING HOURS**

The Contractor will schedule work between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday unless authorized by the Town or its representative to do otherwise. Emergency work will be conducted on an as needed basis.

#### **SECTION 13.0 - LICENSES AND PERMITS**

The Contractor shall, at his expense, procure all necessary licenses and permits needed to conduct the work required under the terms of this contract. It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to obtain all necessary permits, lane closure permits and other needed authorization to conduct tree maintenance operations on all rights-of-way. The Contractor shall give any and all necessary formal notices required in conjunction with the lawful execution of the work of this contract.

#### **SECTION 14.0 - SUBCONTRACTS**

The Contractor will not be allowed to subcontract work under this contract unless written approval is granted by the town. The Subcontractor, as approved, shall be bound by the conditions of the contract between the Town and the Contractor. The authorized Subcontractor is to perform work in accordance with all terms of the contract and specifications. All required notices, work orders, directives, and requests for emergency services will be directed to the Contractor. All directions given to the Subcontractor in the field shall bind the Contractor as if the notice had been given directly to the Contractor.

#### **SECTION 15.0 - EXECUTION OF CONTRACT**

The successful Bidder shall, within 15 calendar days of the mailing of written notice of selection as the successful bidder, enter into contract with the town on forms as included within the bidding documents for the appropriate bonds, indemnities and insurances required hereunder.

The contract, when executed, shall be deemed to include the entire agreement between the parties; the Contractor shall not base any claim for modification of the contract upon any prior representation or promise made by representatives of the City, or other persons.

#### **SECTION 16.0 - SUPERVISION**

This contract will be under the direct supervision of the town or its authorized representatives. Any alterations or modifications of the work performed under this contract shall be made only by written agreement between the Contractor and the town authorized representatives and shall be made prior to commencement of the altered or



modified work. No claims for extra work or materials shall be allowed unless covered by written agreement.

### **SECTION 17.0 - WORK CREW SUPERVISION**

- A. The Contractor shall provide qualified supervision of each crew at all times while working under this contract. Each supervisor shall be authorized by the Contractor to accept and act upon all directives issued by the Town. Failure for the supervisor to act on said directives shall be sufficient cause to give notice that the Contractor is in default of the contract unless such directives would create potential personal injury or safety hazards. In addition the contractor will provide two way radio/cellular phone for communications between the Tree Warden and each crew and notify him each day the locations in which he will be working.
- B. Foreman/Climber who has skills necessary for working in trees from an aerial lift/tower or by the use of ropes, saddles and other hand climbing equipment and having proficiency in operating all other related mechanical equipment such as loaders, etc. as well as provide supervision of the emergency work force and shall have responsibility for giving directions, making decisions, and assuming responsibility for all work completed by the contractor.

### **SECTION 18.0 - PAYMENTS**

Partial billings are acceptable on a weekly basis. Payment is made according to the percent of work completed determined by the Tree Warden. A 5% retainage will be held by the town until all work is completed.

All invoices should include a separate spreadsheet detailing which trees and/or stumps were removed, equipment cost, labor cost per person, and any other expenses incurred. The vendor should assure that the total of the invoice agrees with the total of the spreadsheet.

Again, any change orders to the contract must be approved by town authorized representatives in advance of services being rendered.

### **SECTION 19.0 - TREE REMOVAL**

- A. Trees shall be removed in accordance with accepted industry standards and procedures and in accordance with the following minimum requirements:
- B. Extreme care shall be taken so as to prevent limbs, branches and trunks from falling and creating damage to adjacent homes, driveways, sidewalks, streets and other property, both public and private.
- C. Limbs and branches larger than four (4) inches in diameter shall be lowered to the ground through the use of ropes or other mechanical devices.

- D. Debris and logs shall not be left on the public right of way overnight. It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to remove and dispose in a proper and acceptable manner all logs, brush and debris resulting from the tree removal operation unless otherwise directed by the town.
- E. The contractor removing the tree is responsible for grinding stumps and bracing roots at least six inches below grade. Chips and residue can be returned to the hole. At least a two inch thick layer of topsoil shall be placed over any chips and residue. The area shall be crowned at least two inches above surrounding grade to allow for settling and shall be raked smooth. The contractor shall restore any damaged turf areas and grades due to vehicular or mechanical operations. At the direction of the town, Contractor will re-seed the area with approved grass seed.

## **SECTION 20.0 - CONTRACT TERMINATION**

The Town shall have the right to terminate a contract or a part thereof before the work is completed in the event that:

1. Previous unknown circumstances arise making it desirable in the public interest to void the contract.
2. The contractor is not adequately complying with the specifications.
3. Proper arboricultural techniques are not being followed after warning notification given by the town or its authorized representatives.
4. The contractor refuses, neglects, or fails to supply properly trained or skilled supervisory personal and/or workers or proper equipment of the specified quality and quantity.
5. The contractor in the judgment of the town is unnecessarily or willfully delaying the performance and completion of the work.
6. The contractor refuses to proceed with work when and as directed by the town.
7. The contractor abandons the work.

## **SECTION 21.0 - INDEMNIFICATION**

I, the Contractor, agree to indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the Town from and against any and all loss, damage, or expense which the Town may suffer or for which the City may be held liable by reason of any injury (including death) or damage to any property arising out of negligence on the part of the Contractor in the execution of the work to be performed hereunder.
