Closure of Longbrook Avenue (Correction)

September 2020

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), in conjunction with the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) and the Stratford Health Department are providing this notice that starting Monday, September 14th Longbrook Avenue will be closed 24/7 in the immediate area of the railroad bridge.

Total closure of this portion of Longbrook Avenue is necessary to allow for the connection of the new Haul Road (shown below) on the former Contract Plating property to Longbrook Avenue. This connection requires the relocation of telephone poles and significant grading. A flashing warning light will also be installed at the railroad bridge to warn of turning trucks at the new Haul Road entrance. The Haul Road is being constructed to facilitate clean-up of the Raymark Superfund Site and will be the primary route for moving Raymark Waste to the former ballfield for consolidation and capping. Construction of the Haul Road will prevent hundreds of trucks which would otherwise have had to travel further up Longbrook Avenue and through the Patterson Avenue neighborhood.

This closure will be 24/7 until the work is completed. The contractor, Tantara, Inc., estimates this work will take 2 to 4 weeks to complete. We apologize in advance for any inconvenience.
